SVW Meeting Minutes - August 4th, 2021



A Zoom meeting of was called to order. SVW and WBW members invited.
The President's Challenge was One Tool.

Ray Hari, President (SVW) –

1. Ray announced he and Greg went to the high school to experiment with a hybrid meeting: Zoom and in-person. Some audio echo issues need to be resolved. In the meantime, keep sending photos to Greg for Zoom meetings until further notice.
2. Ray announced the Rebecca DeGroot bowl will be raffled off at the September meeting using the Picker Wheel program.
3. The Milk Paint demo was postponed for September, to be a demo at Westbay Woodturners meeting.
4. September 8th is Back to School Night at the high school. Ray will collect all the donations and take to the high school in September.
5. Ray will call a meeting at the high school with all the pen-turning-teacher volunteers to meet with Mitch and discuss resumption of classes on pen turning.

Jim Loney, Treasurer (SVW) –

1. Jim reported he has not received any raffle money for the Rebecca DeGroot Bowl raffle.
2. Jim mentioned the club is up to 75 members - 6 are lifetime, 69 are paid.

Tom Gaston, President (WBW) –

1. Tom mentioned 32 members plus 8 guests have signed up for the WBW picnic. It's an outside venue, a first in-person session in 1½ years. Asked people to bring one or two woodturnings.
2. Starting September 13th, WBW has secured the Church for in-person meetings. Lots of space, windows can be open. Both clubs are invited. Discussed hybrid meeting ideas – people from home ask questions to one person at the meeting, etc.

Tom Kenyon (CA Glue) –

1. Tom replenished the glues. He will take to the picnic if it arrives in time. The order contains special orders. Tom asked for volunteer to take glue to some meetings, so he doesn't have to go to every meeting, both clubs. Ray mentioned that Don has accepted to be the liaison.

Jerry Galli ("Pens for the Troops") –

1. Jerry picked up 200 more pen kits and will take to the picnic, along with pen blanks. Jerry needs the turned pens into him by the November meeting.

President's Challenge – One Tool, then Show & Tell

1. Greg started showing the pictures members had presented for the President's Challenge and the Show & Tell. Members discussed the history of their work, showed the tool used for the President's Challenge and how they made the project with one tool, including materials, and finish. Members asked questions and presenters answered.
2. The meeting was adjourned after all the pictures were shown.
