



Virtual Meetings



Rebecca DeGroot Demo






far from sketching strange creatures or making lists of ideas she is longing to try.



When Rebecca completed the demo, there was further discussions with the members as to her techniques and her finishing ideas and materials. A Q&A continued with a variety of topics.


Adjournment – The meeting was adjourned at the end of the Q&A




