Fractal Burning with Bob Bley

Bob Bley shared his experiences of creating unique designs in wood by utilizing high voltage burning with the club at the October meeting. Bob began the night with a PowerPoint presentation explaining the procedures used and the cautions that must be ob-


served. There are a number of salt solutions that Bob has tried as wetting agents to enable the fractal burning and Bob had samples of the resultant burn patterns to pass around. This process is more art than science and there seem to be more variables than definitive parameters. Bob described his trials of developing safe and



Bob also included photographs of pieces he had done along with vases by Dave Plemons, who pioneered the technique of fractal burning on turned wood art pieces in this area and Dennis Lillis's Southwest inspired hollow form.







Show and tell is fine and dandy, but nothing beats smoke and flame! Bob lead the parade

of inquisitive club members out of the classroom and into the woodshop where he had set up his live demonstration. Bob sprayed on a salt solution to a test board and used a paint brush to finish the application. He then placed the board on the bench and located one probe at each end of



the board. The high voltage was applied and nothing happened, at first, but soon a stuttering branch of burning arc traveled down the board between the two probes. Bob went on to show the results of repositioning the probes and the effect on differently shaped wood pieces.








I got the distinct impression that most club members felt that this was a great way for **someone else** to decorate a wood turning!
