We had challengers for the President's challenge. Rich Johnson brought in a large Walnut mushroom and Ron Newcomb (the mushroom king) brought in four sets of multiple mushrooms. He had ones made of glued up Baltic Birch, ones with the wood fibers cut and rolled under the mushroom cap to form a skirt. He even made a mushroom log, where he glued his broken mushrooms to a half section log.



During the break. The judging was to be based on guidelines we are trying to use for a fair comparison of the work presented. These are: Utilization of wood as a medium (20%), Shape and Correctness (20%), Technical Skill (30%), Spirit of the Theme (15%), and Artistic Impact (15%). But in this case Ron Newcomb won the coin toss.


Wood Turning Classes:

- Ron Newcomb showed us a long releasable stainless steel band that can be used for segmented turning. They don't cost much, \$2.20 ea. And Jeff Thorson works at Ace Hardware will see if he can order us some.
- Chuck Jorgensen/Craig Thorsen sponsored a motion to provide Associate Membership for family members, wives, others, etc. Motion was made by Anna Schipper and 2'nd by Mike Rude. Amended to: Member can join and for an additional fee of 50% of the current membership fee, can include as associate member(s) Wives, other family members, significant other, etc. The motion was passed. The current membership fee is \$20.00 and the Family Plan would be \$30.00. The half-year (July to Dec.) fee is \$10.00 and the Family plan would be \$15.00.


Gene Garrison spoke to the club concerning support for the Liberty Lodge Boy's Training Center in St. Vincent the West Indies. This center houses, teaches and councils boys who have been removed from their Families due to neglect, abuse, or any number of problems that affect a child's development. The center houses up to 40 boys and teaches various practical disciplines including woodworking. The wood shop is used to support the school and to teach cabinet making and woodturning. During Gene's visit to the center he noted that the shop has a number of pieces of serviceable equipment but has no money to buy tools and supplies. Gene ask the club members to donate any old turning tools to the school since their present tools are ground down to the last inch or so. A No.2MT live center is needed and grinding wheels once the wheel size is determined. Hand tools would also be appreciated. The club voted to support the effort with a \$50.00 grant for postage. To date club members have donated a dowel jig, dowels, transfer pins, hearing protection, earmuffs, a set of pliers, two gouges, and an SVW cap. Worthy of note is that the club initials, SVW, looks a lot like St. Vincent, West Indies.
